Thank you for participating in our services as an usher. You were assigned to usher for one month, both services. Please remember that ushering is an important part of the worship service. You are actually helping the congregation to prepare for the worship by greeting them into the service and providing a bulletin. Therefore, you should approach the task of ushering with the proper attitude. This is the Lord's work and you should feel honored that you have been asked to be an usher and should try to do it to the best of your ability.

At this time we are giving worshippers the opportunity to seat themselves where they feel comfortable, so you will not be required to usher people to their seats.

Here are some guidelines to help you perform the duties of ushering in the proper manner.

The Center Aisle usher is the captain of his team and is to take charge in emergency situations.

- (1) Please be at the church <u>at least 20 minutes</u> before the worship service begins. Please dress appropriately.
- (2) Be friendly and courteous and greet people with a smile.
- (3) Be sure you have enough bulletins so as not to run out and have to leave your position to get more.
- (4) Keep in mind those who need special seating.
- (5) Close sanctuary doors once the worship service has started. You can open doors for late-comers during the opening song or greeting.
- (6) Remember you are on duty for the entire service. Never leave the church before the service is completed. In case of an emergency, the usher must be present.
- (7) If an emergency arises, the ushers must take charge. The captain must instruct the other ushers what to do. In case of fire, he should send an usher to each exit to open the doors and direct the people to the exits in a calm and orderly manner. In case of illness (fainting, etc.), please assist the person to the nearest exit.
- (8) If you cannot be present at a service when it is your turn to usher, please find your own substitute.
- (9) You will usher for all services for one month. This includes any special services during the week, such as Thanksgiving, Christmas, etc.
- (10) We ask that you try to sit in one of the back pews of the sanctuary during the worship service, so that you are aware if there are any late-comers or any other problems come up during the service.
